What's for LUNCH?

Last Friday, following the assembly, a Community Conversation was held to discuss our Hot Lunch Program. Thank you for those able to participate in the conversation. Julie Turino was present along with several of the hot lunch volunteers. Amy Morse and Mary Christenson were also present on behalf of the Faculty Council.

We began with some facts:

Goals and Intentions:

We provide a100% organic, vegetarian lunch, affordable at \$3.50 per meal, and locally sourced as much as possible. It is also an intention for meals to be kid-friendly and enticing to young and growing palates. Julie has been working with the following organizations to acquire quality food at reasonable prices: Driftless Co-option for grains and pastas, Earth Fire Products for tomato sauce, Viroqua Food Co-op for fruits and miscellaneous items, and Community Hunger Solutions for local organic produce. Just recently, there were greens from our greenhouse as part of our salad.



Staggering Quantities:

Two dozen onions per week, 40-60 pounds of cheese, 12 bulbs of garlic, 50 pounds of flour, 30 pounds of pasta, 2 bushels of fruits and vegetables.

Menu:

Monday is "Italian," Tuesday is "Mexican," Wednesday is soup/stew, and Thursday is the "Wild Card" day.

People:

Julie is the Chief Chef, Trevor and Sol are the regular kitchen staff, and there are MANY volunteers as well! Two volunteers per day to help with food prep and serving. Upper grade students are also scheduled to help serve their peers.

Budget:

Meals sold (as of end of February) total over 9,000, plus the additional meals for faculty and staff.

Income reached \$33,833.37; expenses \$23,677.22 – net is tracking at around \$10,000. Julie had made some excellent financial steps by using Driftless Food Co-option and Community Hunger Solutions. Viroqua Food Co-op donates boxes of fruits and vegetables regularly beyond their annual cash donation.

Developments:

Electricity upgrades, fresh paint, stainless steel tables, shelving and the walk-in

refrigerator/freezer! Next...a dishwasher!

Challenges:

Availability of produce, affordability, food waste, and labor needs for processing food to fill the freezer.

Inclusivity of meal balance for gluten and dairy-free.

Opportunities:

How might brown rice pasta be swapped for wheat-based pasta?

What are other gluten-free grains to include (e.g., guinoa, millet)?

Can a hardboiled or scrambled egg be included as a protein?

What about a frittata?

Enhance the meal with a side?

Can there be more descriptions of the meals available on the website so parents know what the meal consists of prior to ordering? Note gluten-free and dairy-free on the menus. **Vision:**

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- Integrating the Hot Lunch Program with the Gardening Program – beginning this spring. Plant vegetables that will be well-suited for processing for the Hot Lunch Program.
- Integrating the Hot Lunch Program with the "service" curriculum - how might classes of students participate in meal prep using the produce from our garden or other sourced for a meal later that week or to fill the freezer.
- Embracing the Hot Lunch Program by our entire community through a renewed relationship to the garden – summer help is needed to tend the garden and harvest and process produce.

Before the end of the school year, look for a survey to include your voice in further developing our Hot Lunch Program. There is a strong legacy of an amazing offering of food for our children as they take up the important work of exploring the world through Waldorf education.
