<u>Bat Safety</u>

WALDORF

A bat found on the sidewalk by 3rd graders near the school on Monday captured a lot of attention from PRWS children. Ansel, our 8th grade bat expert, would like to give everyone a friendly reminder to make sure that children know to **never touch wild bats** with their hands or sticks, etc. Bats often carry rabies that can be spread by bites and even saliva, so children should not touch bats in any way. The best way for children to help bats is to ask an adult for help. The animal control officer is available to help and can be contacted through the Viroqua Police Department at 637-2121. Also, the wildlife rehabilitation program at the Coulee Region Humane Society in La Crosse is another place to call for assistance at 608-781-4014. Ansel called Viroqua Animal Control on Monday, and the officer cared for the bat found by the 3rd arade and relocated it to a safe location.

Music Instrument Return and Summer Rental

Instruments rented from the school need to be returned before the end of the school year. If you will be returning the instrument, you may drop it off in the office or return it to **Amber Knutson who will be available in the lobby to check in the instrument at drop-off and pickup on Friday, May 26.** She will also have forms to fill out to sign up for the summer rental program.

If you are currently renting an instrument from the school and would like to continue to rent it over the summer, you will need to fill out the rental paperwork before the last day of school. The cost for the summer is \$40 for stringed instruments and \$20 for recorders. Instruments must be returned either to Amber or dropped off in the office. They should not just be left in the hallway.

If your instrument is not returned before the end of school, you will be charged the summer rental fee.

<u>Re-Enrollment - Final Steps</u>

Please note the following changes to the reenrollment process this year. To complete your children's re-enrollment for the 2017-2018 school year, the following items are **due by** June 30th, 2017:

- Your payment plan in the form of either post-dated checks for the entire year or a completed ACH (Automated Clearing House) form. ACH forms are available in the office.
- Any open balances for 2016-2017 or any prior years, including all raffle and instrument rental balances are brought current.
- A \$150 supply fee for each grade student and a \$250 fee for each kindergarten student enrolled for 2017-2018.

Please note that your re-enrollment is not finished until these steps are completed. Contracts finalized after June 30, 2017, will be assessed a \$250 late fee.

You are welcome to drop in between 9:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays through the end of May to check on your account balance and finalize your contract or email <u>finance@plesantridgewaldorf.org</u> to make an appointment. I will be happy to assist you in any way possible. For questions, email or call (608) 637-7828.
