## **ADMIN UPDATES**

### Morning Routine

This is a reminder to all students and families that we begin each school day outside on the playground. Students will gather each morning on the playground and remain outside until school begins at 8:10 a.m. The exceptions to our Morning Routine are when students need to bring their instruments inside (using the Court Ave. entrance) or when there is heavy rain or extremely cold weather conditions. *(We will post a sign to let students and families know when we have indoor morning recess.)* When students bring in their instruments, they may do so quickly and then exit immediately to rejoin the other students on the playground.

with the "POSTCARD EXCHANGE"**

So far 1,200 postcards have been mailed to each of our schools from the International Waldorf100 world coordinating committee.



The "Postcard Exchange" is a project in which every Waldorf school in the world is invited to send a postcard to every other Waldorf school in the world, receiving in return 1,200 postcards individually designed by a young person, telling or showing us something of his or her country, school, or self. As the postcards are received, each school is encouraged to create a global map that gradually reveals where Waldorf schools are located all over the world.

To simplify the project, every school has been sent blank, pre-addressed postcards they can use. The right side of the postcard contains the address of the destination school. On the left is space for your school address. Students can design the main empty side of the postcard any way they want. The more individual and diverse, the better.
