### Re-Enrollment - Final Steps

**Please note the following changes to the re-enrollment process this year.** To complete your children's re-enrollment for the 2018-2019 school year, the following items are **due by June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2018:**

- Your payment plan in the form of either post-dated checks for the entire year or a completed ACH (automatic withdrawal) form. ACH forms are available in the office or by email.
- Any open balances for 2017-2018 or any prior years, including all raffle and instrument rental balances, must be brought current.
- A \$150 supply fee for each grade student and a \$250 grocery fee for each kindergarten student enrolled for 2018-2019.

**Please note that your re-enrollment is not finished until these steps are completed. Contracts finalized after June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2018, will be assessed a \$250 late fee.**

Please stop at the Business Office between 8:15 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays, or Fridays or between 1 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. on Tuesdays through the end of May or email [finance@pleasantrydorgewaldorf.org](mailto:finance@pleasantrydorgewaldorf.org) to make an appointment to finalize your contract.
