<u>Music Instrument Return and</u> <u>Summer Rentals</u>

Instruments rented from the school need to be returned before the end of the school year. If you will be returning the instrument, 7th graders should return it during their last class on Monday, May 20th, and all other grades should return theirs on Wednesday, May 22nd, during their last class. No instruments should just be left in the hallway or music room. They must all be checked in.

If you wish to rent your child's instrument over the summer, you will need to fill out the rental paperwork before the instrument-return date. Summer instrument rental forms are available in the front office.

If your instrument is not returned before the end of school, you will be charged the summer rental fee.

<u>Re-Enrollment - Final Steps</u>

To complete your children's re-enrollment for the 2019-2020 school year, the following items are **due by June 15th, 2019**:

- Your payment plan in the form of either post-dated checks for the entire year or a completed ACH (automatic withdrawal) form. ACH forms are available in the office or by email.
- Any open balances for the 2018-2019 school year or any prior years, including all raffle and instrument rental balances, must be brought current.
- A \$225 supply fee for each grade student and a \$250 grocery fee for each kindergarten student enrolled for 2019-2020.

Please note that your re-enrollment is not finished until these steps have been completed. Contracts finalized after June 15th, 2019, will be assessed a \$250 late fee.
